CULTIVATING YOUR COMMUNITY

God makes it very clear throughout his Word: we aren't meant to live this life alone. This is especially true in ministry. You need a community to surround you with prayer, friendship, accountability, mentorship, and guidance.

Dream and pray about what it might look like to have a community of support behind you while you serve in cross-cultural ministry: friends, family, brothers and sisters in Christ, spiritual mentors. Describe what that would look like. How would it impact your ministry? Your life?
